

2023 SPSP Publications Demographic Survey Data Report

Background

The SPSP Anti-Colorism and Eurocentrism in Methods and Practices (ACEMAP) task force developed a demographic survey for authors, reviewers, editorial boards, and editor teams of SPSP journals to complete yearly to enhance inclusive excellence in publication practices. For the purposes of transparency and accountability, the demographic information is being posted publicly in aggregate form. When possible, reporting results for specific and disaggregated identities and subgroups is preferred. However, for this report, we have regrouped identities together under a more general terms (e.g., to maintain anonymity or confidentiality, or to gain a simplified understanding of the data).

Response Rates

PSPB Editorial Board: 19% (23 out of 118)PSPR Editorial Board: 98% (99 out of 101)

PSPB Editors: 54% (15 out of 28)PSPR Editors: 100% (5 out of 5)

Distribution Notes

- Survey was distributed via SurveyMonkey to the editorial teams on May 30 with a reminder on June 9. An email was also sent directly from Rachel Puffer on May 30 alerting the recipients to the survey.
- The PSPR editorial board was surveyed earlier in the year by Jonathan Adler so we did not resurvey them at this time. Moving forward we will distribute the survey each January and can include that group in 2024.
